# 1. INTRODUCTION

## 1.1 Welcome to Santiago 2023

The Pan American and Parapan American games are a sport party, with a world class organization that allows the athletes from the Americas to reach excellence. The celebration will unfold the natural beauty, dynamism, and multicultural energy of Santiago de Chile.

## 1.2 Santiago as a city

Santiago, the capital city of Chile, was founded 482 years ago, on February 12th, 1541. It is located in the central zone of the country; its landscape is complemented in the background by the Andes Mountain range. With a Mediterranean weather, it rains only in winter and at a height of 570 meters (1870 ft) above sea level, the city offers the ideal conditions for the high-performance athletes.

By 2023, the Santiago metro will have a layout of 149 kilometers (93 mi) in length, with 143 stations that will go through 28 districts. It will be the second largest subway network in Latin America, and it will connect the Pan American Village (Cerrillos station) with the Estadio Nacional within only 12 minutes. Every official venue in Santiago has a connection to a subway station or is a short distance away by bus.

With a population of 6.1 million inhabitants, Santiago is the largest city in Chile and the sixth in South America.

The currency that we use in Chile is the Chilean peso (CLP). You can also use American dollars (USD) and euros (EUR).

Spanish is the de facto and the administrative language of Chile. A 9.9% of the population speaks and understands the languages of the indigenous people, including Mapudungun is spoken by around 100 thousand and 200 thousand people, Aymara by around 20 thousand, Quichua by around eight thousand people and Rapanui by around 3,300 people.

## 1.3 The city as the host of large sport events

Chile has been the host of several sports events and international meetings in the last years. The Dakar Rally, between the editions of 2019 and 2015, together with the 2014 South American Games, are some of the examples that show that the country is ready to receive world class events. That is how the country provides its infrastructure and safety.

To become the host of the XIX Pan American Games and the VII Parapan American Games in 2023 is of utmost importance for the city and a country that seeks to celebrate the sports spirit in the Americas, and that aims to leave a legacy of social transformation that promotes an active lifestyle and inspires the society and future generations. In Santiago we are getting ready to welcome 6,916 Pan American athletes that come from 41 countries who will compete in 39 sports and 60 disciplines.

While the Parapan American Games are awaiting the visit of 1,927 athletes from 33 countries in 17 sports and 18 disciplines.

As previously pointed out, Chile was part of the official tour of the Dakar Rally in seven editions, between 2009 and 2015. On the occasion more than three thousand vehicles competed in national territory.

Santiago, together with five sub-venues, organized the South American Games of 2014. In this competition, 4,300 athletes, together with 3,000 volunteers and 400 thousand spectators participated. In 2015 the sub-17 football world cup was held in eight cities of the country. 24 delegations that traveled 63,500 kilometers (39,457 miles) participated along Chile. Another football event of continental relevance was the organization of the Americas Cup 2015, over 650 thousand spectators, more than 3,600 media professionals and over 24 thousand accreditations were considered.

In 2017, Santiago was the location of the South American Youth Games (ODESUR). This event gathered 1,200 athletes from 14 countries, who performed in 21 different disciplines in 18 venues within the city. Our country has experience in large sports events. The rugby junior world cup (2019), the water ski world championship (2013), Polo championship (2015), Junior Field Hockey world Cup (2016), the roller hockey world cup (2016), the Bolivarian beach games (2016), the ITTF world tour (2016), and the volleyball South American Championship (2017), highlight the enthusiasm Chile has put into the organization and execution of sports events of international relevance.

## 1.4 Santiago 2023

Chile will host the Pan American Games for the first time in its history.

## 1.5 Fiu, the Official Mascot

Fiu is a Seven-colored tanager bird and was chosen to represent Chile in the Pan American and Parapan American games. Fiu is the sound of its song. It lives in the wetlands of Chile along its territory. Even though it's a small bird, it always gives its biggest effort, the same as every athlete who seeks new challenges every day. Its seven colors mean strength, consistency, respect, determination, honesty, fellowship, and passion.

Fiu's colors, apart from the previously mentioned values, represent the diversity of human beings and species: all the races, languages and beliefs from everyone who will participate at Santiago 2023.

Almost 50 thousand people were the ones that gave their preference to choose the official mascot of the games, an impressive record, since it bested the participation at Guadalajara 2011, Toronto 2015 and Lima 2019.

At first, we received several interesting proposals, but from those we chose five mascots to put up for voting: Fiu, Pewü, Chitama, Juanchi and Santi. Every single one of them had great stories behind them, which were available for the citizens to choose during August of 2021 on the website [www.santiago2023.org](http://www.santiago2023.org).

The female and male Boxing competition of the Santiago 2023 XIX Pan American Games will be held from October 21<sup>ST</sup> through the 27<sup>th</sup>, 2023 at the Centro Deportivo Comunitario La Rena, located at 9085 Talinay St., La Reina district, in Santiago de Chile.

Gold, silver, and bronze medals will be awarded in all events of the boxing competition of the Santiago 2023 XIX Pan American Games.



## 2.2 Competition Format

There will be seven (7) weight categories for male and six (6) weight categories for female.

The quota is 130 athletes in total (70 male and 60 female), without prejudice that the NOCs may register additional athletes in accordance with the statements in the section “*Paris 2024 Olympic Games Qualification*”.

The competition will be simple elimination. It will start with preliminary rounds, quarter final rounds, semi-final rounds and final rounds.

The round duration will be in accordance with the rules of the International Boxing Rules:

Male: Each fight must consider three rounds of three minutes each.

Female: Each fight must consider three rounds of three minutes each.

The rest time between rounds will be one minute.

Furthermore, the scoring system will be used in every round, and will be based on the “ten-point system.”

The daily weighing will be done at the hotel for boxers and technical officials.

All athletes must have been born between January the 1st, 1983 and December 31, 2004

The quotas obtained at the Cali 2021 Junior Pan American Games are for the NOC, which will be responsible for entering its best boxer for the Santiago 2023 Pan American Games.

### 2.5.4 Qualification System

The qualification system has been prepared jointly by the International Olympic Committee (IOC), Panam Sports and the Pan American Boxing Confederation. Qualification will be as follows:

1. 1 quota per weight category for the NOCs that won in Cali 2021 (see “Cali 2021 Quotas” section).
2. 1 quota per weight category for Chile as host country.
3. The finalists of each weight category in the Asuncion 2022 South American Games (SAG 2022).
4. The finalists of each weight category in the El Salvador 2023 Central American and Caribbean Games (2023 CACG)

5. 4 quotas per gender for each weight category in the Qualification Championship for the NOCs that have not qualified yet (including the USA and CAN). Only the countries that have not qualified yet will be able to participate in this qualification event.

If the **two** finalists of the South American or Central American and Caribbean Games belong to an NOC that is already qualified, the quotas will be for the **two** NOCs that placed third.

If **only one** of the finalists of the South American or Central American and Caribbean Games belongs to an NOC that is already qualified, the bronze medal winners must dispute the second qualification quota in a combat between them. The result of this combat will be for qualification purposes only and will not change the fact that both athletes won a bronze medal and placed third in the South American or Central American and Caribbean Games.

Qualification for the Santiago 2023 Pan American Games is for the NOC, which will be responsible for determining the athletes who will participate in the Games.

### 2.5.5 Confirmation of quota places

No later than July 10, 2023, the Pan American Boxing Confederation will confirm to the IOC, to Panam Sports and to the NOCs the places that each NOC has qualified until the penultimate qualification event.

No later than July 14, 2023, the NOCs will confirm to the IOC, to Panam Sports and to the Pan American Boxing Confederation the places they will use.

The NOCs that participate in the last Qualification Event must complete their entries by number and long list registration in the system within the established deadline (July 20, 2023).

Before August 21, 2023, the Pan American Boxing Confederation will confirm to the IOC, to Panam Sports and to the NOCs the places that each NOC has qualified until the last qualification event.

Before August 25, 2023, the NOCs that qualify in the last qualification event must confirm to the IOC, to Panam Sports and to the Pan American Boxing Confederation the places they will use.

### 2.5.6 Reallocation of unused quota places

If necessary, the Pan American Boxing Confederation will reallocate unused quota places before August 28, 2023, in accordance with the results of the last Qualification Championship.

The NOCs that receive reallocated quotas must confirm their participation no later than August 30, 2023.

August 28th 2023	Reallocation of quotas
August 30th 2023	The NOCs that received reallocated quotas must confirm their participation
July 20th, 2023	Entry by number deadline
September 29th , 2023	Entry by name deadline

## 2.6 París 2024 Olympic Games Qualification.

The finalists of each weight category for men and for women will obtain direct qualification for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games.

In view of the fact that the event will be a qualifying for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games, all the National Olympic Committees may participate in the Pan American Games and register additional athletes in the categories that they have not qualified for yet, considering the following:

- Only one athlete per NOC may participate per weight category

- The athletes must be registered and accredited by their NOC through the Santiago 2023 system and within the dates established for the Pan American Games.
- Additional athletes will be accommodated in accordance with the provisions of the boxing policy that can be found on the extranet and in the Chef of Mission Guide.
- All the expenses must be covered by the NOC or by the National Federation (airline ticket, accommodation, transportation, meals).
- The additional athletes will receive an accreditation for the Pan American Games and if they win a medal, they will be eligible to receive it.

## 2.7 Rules, protests and appeals

### 2.7.1 Rules

The Boxing competition will be held in accordance with the International Boxing Regulations, and supervised by the IOC.

### 2.7.2 Protests and appeals

All protests and appeals will be resolved in accordance with the procedures defined by the current International Boxing rules, and supervised by the IOC.

### 2.7.3 Use of brands in sports equipment and clothing

The competition uniforms, non-competition uniforms and sports equipment for the Santiago 2023 Pan American Games must comply with the statements in “Guidelines for uniforms and sports equipment of the Games” from Panam Sports, which complies with the requirements of the International Federations for each sport.
